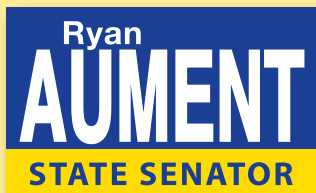
I hope that you will take the time to read through my “Blueprint for a Stronger Pennsylvania” and offer me not only feedback on what is presented, but any ideas you may have as well.

## ECONOMIC GROWTH

- **Spur economic development through tax cuts and tax reform** that make Pennsylvania’s business tax structure more attractive for new employers and less burdensome for current employers.
- **Streamline laws and regulations to reduce the cost of doing business** in Pennsylvania and ensure that businesses face fair, predictable and consistent oversight.
- **Get government out of private sector businesses** such as liquor sales, hotels, and more to allow business growth across the state.
- **Leverage our educational system**, particularly our colleges and universities, in the development of new technologies and ideas to drive future economic expansion.
- **Pass strong lawsuit abuse reforms that help end costly frivolous lawsuits** such as “loser pays,” and create a business specialty court to ensure job creators and plaintiffs are afforded a fair and speedy resolution to complex litigation issues.
- **Free the entrepreneurial spirit of Pennsylvanians** by reducing regulation and other roadblocks for start-up businesses.
- **Partner with the private sector** by bringing together elected officials, business leaders, educational leaders and community organizations to advance the best ideas and most successful economic growth policies.

### The Aument Record

- Reduced Pennsylvania’s onerous business taxes
- Supported tort and regulatory reforms to make Pennsylvania more fair to employers
- Fostered growth in Pennsylvania’s emerging industries and the new jobs they are bringing to our state
- Supported common sense changes like increasing the Net Operating Loss Carryforward and implementing a Single Sales Factor for tax purposes

## TAXPAYER PROTECTION

- **Reform the public pension system** by placing all new hires into a defined contribution system like the private sector receives and encouraging current enrollees to switch to the same.
- **Limit the growth of government spending** through Constitutional Amendment or by statute to prohibit increases above the rate of wage growth, inflation or population.
- **Pass school property tax reform and reform the current school funding formula** to provide relief to all homeowners while still ensuring quality schools for our children.
- **Repeal prevailing wage requirements** at the state, county and municipal level to provide an even playing field for all Pennsylvania businesses and save tax dollars.
- **Cap school property taxes** for all seniors age 65 and older with a means test to income.
- **Require a super-majority for any tax increase** that requires a two-thirds vote in both chambers.
- **Eliminate unfunded mandates** to reduce costs for municipal governments and school districts.
- **Utilize public-private partnerships** to more effectively manage public assets such as the Pennsylvania Turnpike.
- **Investigate further changes to the welfare system** to ensure recipients are looking for work, end abuse, and maintain time limits on how long someone can receive benefits.

### The Aument Record

- ➔ Strong and consistent supporter of property tax relief legislation
- ➔ Voted to reduce our state’s debt ceiling by \$2.5 billion and for a stringent new review process for RACP projects
- ➔ Provided stronger protections for property taxpayers by further limiting the Act 1 exemptions school districts may claim when considering tax increases
- ➔ Implemented significant changes to the welfare system including random drug testing of past drug users and implementing a new electronic welfare eligibility confirmation system to end fraud
- ➔ Voted to ensure that illegal aliens or non-legal residents can not receive public benefits paid by taxpayers

## GOVERNMENT REFORM

- **Reduce the size of the legislature** to help save tax dollars and improve efficiency.
- **End legislative per diems** and require all legislators to submit for legitimate expenses only by following I.R.S. guidelines.
- **End government programs, fees or taxes which no longer meet their original mandate** after independent review by a Sunset Commission.
- **Make Pennsylvania a Right-to-Work state** that stops the forced unionization — and increased costs associated with it — on our state’s citizens and employers.
- **Reform the legislative pension system** by placing all current and future legislators into a defined contribution system.
- **Create a Pennsylvania Accountability Commission** to oversee the completion of audits of every state department and agency, as well as identify and eliminate duplicate programs, regulations, etc.
- **End taxpayer-funded collection of public sector union dues and political monies.**
- **Ensure timely passage of the state budget** and create a temporary “default state budget” if an agreement is not reached by the June 30 deadline; prohibit action on non-budget related legislation after June 15 if no budget is enacted by that time.
- **Utilize the power of the technology to make more documents available to the public in a shorter time frame** including proposed legislation, campaign finance reports and more.

### The Aument Record

- Refuses the taxpayer-paid per diems and mileage reimbursements for his work in Harrisburg
- Sponsored and voted for legislation to reduce the size of the legislature
- Voted to create PennWatch, an online database of all state spending that allows taxpayers to see how their money is being utilized
- Supported new rules that force legislators to pay for a portion of their own healthcare as those in the private sector must do
- Posted his legislative office and personal expenses on-line from day one

## EDUCATION

- **Increase educational choice and competition** to provide parents and students greater opportunity for educational achievement.
- **Embrace new technology and innovation** to provide students with such things as online learning, AP courses, courses not available at their local schools, SAT preparation, tutoring and more.
- **Ensure Pennsylvania’s school curricula are driven by Pennsylvania’s parents, teachers, students and communities** by continuing to oppose federal Common Core standards.
- **Reform the teacher tenure system** to ensure we are keeping teachers for their abilities, not their time served in schools; allow school districts to remove ineffective teachers regardless of tenure status.
- **Utilize public-private partnerships** to create innovative after-school programs, as well as provide classroom construction, leasing, maintenance and other services.
- **Pass economic furlough reform** to allow schools to keep the best teachers in times of economic need rather than those who have simply served longer.
- **Open school administrator positions to those outside the teaching structure** to harness the skills and abilities of those proven at management in the private sector.
- **Implement a merit pay system for teachers and administrators** to incentivize those in our schools to provide a better education for our children.
- **Reform the current school funding formula** to ensure all school districts are treated fairly.

### The Aument Record

- Authored the law that created Pennsylvania’s new Teacher Effectiveness Program and the state’s first School Performance Profiles
- Stood up against federal Common Core standards to preserve local control of curriculum
- Voted for an improved EITC program that lets the private sector help provide educational choice
- Standing up to the powerful teachers’ union to advance tenure and furlough reform legislation
- Co-sponsored SchoolWATCH to increase transparency for taxpayers

## OUR COMMUNITY

- **Continue to oppose ObamaCare’s federal mandates** that are hurting local businesses and families, and increasing healthcare costs.
- **Provide flexibility to family owned farms** to expand their operations into non-traditional areas to help them survive and grow in today’s economy.
- **Oppose new gun control proposals** that infringe on the rights of law abiding gun owners.
- **Protect the right of parents to educate their children how they choose** be it through public, private, charter or home schooling.
- **Protect the unborn** by opposing any weakening of Pennsylvania’s Abortion Control Act, as well as supporting organizations whose goal is to prevent abortions.
- **Ensure the safety of our community’s roads and bridges** through strong oversight of the new transportation funding mechanism.
- **Protect private property rights through eminent domain reform** that makes it harder for governments to seize land from its owners.
- **Support faith based initiatives** that help provide funding and services for the disadvantaged.
- **Ensure the safety of our neighborhoods** by bringing together law enforcement, community leaders, residents and the legislature to design and implement cost effective programs which help reduce crime and deal with the proliferation of illegal drugs.

### The Aument Record

- Authoring a “Freedom Protection Initiative” legislative package to protect freedom of conscience and protect citizens from the over-reach of ObamaCare
- Passed strong, new regulations for any medical facility that provides abortion services to prevent a repeat of Philadelphia’s abortion “house of horrors”
- Passed the Castle Doctrine to provide greater legal protections for gun owners protecting their families and property
- Co-sponsored the Marriage Protection Amendment
- Authored an amendment to make the proposed “Ultrasound Bill” stronger

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
